#### What have we been doing this week?

What a fantastic week we have had in Year R! We have enjoyed continuing our learning about Spring by going on our woodland walk. During this walk we pointed out the first signs of Spring such as blossom and flower buds. Can you spot any other signs of spring on your walk to and from school? A BIG thank you to all the grown-ups that helped us on this walk.



In Maths, we have begun to look at odd and even numbers. To do this we used numicon to work out which pieces were flat (even) and which pieces were odd (bumpy). We split numbers up into their odd and even piles.











# What have we done this week?

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### Year 1 News

Wow! What a fantastic trip we had to Ropley Station this week. Even with some rain, it did not dampen the children's spirits! We all enjoyed looking around the station, riding the miniature railway, walking across the bridge from Harry Potter and handling objects from the station and the Victorian time period. Back in school, the children wrote recounts about their trip using time words to help them organise their sentences.



In maths, we have been recapping our learning on finding halves and quarters. We have been doing this physically with counters in the classroom and then applying this to the bar model. It would be great to continue practicing these skills over the holidays. Could you find half of you Easter eggs or raisins or socks? Any item can be used!



We started the week by making an Easter treat! The children have been learning about mathematical 'nets' and used all their practise to fold and make their own box which they then decorated with a beautiful Easter design. We then made Easter nest cakes to go inside their box. All if the children looked really proud leaving the classroom with their professionally packaged cake!



### **Beyond the Gate - Forest School**

For the final week of Spring Term, the children went on a flora scavenger hunt around the site looking for specific species of plants growing and identifying them from pictures and information given.

They even found plants which were not on the

sheet – such as Greater Stitchwort and Forget-me-Knots. Mrs Dear was impressed with how well they could describe the differences between Dock Leaves and Lords'n'Ladies. And they learnt the difference between a buttercup flower and a Lesser Celandine flower.



objective where they are expected to be able to name and identify different types of flowers and plants and Mrs Dear will extend this learning in the summer term.



Some children then enjoyed foraging the plants that were plentiful (remembering the rule "1 for you and 10 for nature"). They then weaved them onto a cardboard egg template to create a nature decorated festive

egg!

Other children chose to use tools to create an Easter nest. They had the opportunity to use the bow saw to saw a block of wood and then the stumpy hammers to hammer nails into a circle, before weaving twigs and foraged materials around them.

Plenty of free play was also enjoyed by all, with the children continuing to enjoy the readily available loose parts and equipment to spark their

imaginative play!

We also had fun throwing our wildflower seed bombs – which we made last week – around areas of the site! Lets hope they germinate and we get some lovely wildflowers growing in the summer.
