Year R News

What have we been doing this week?

This week we came back to a special delivery, we were sent a book to read. We had great fun reading the story 'If you're a Monster and you know it....' we listened to the story once before we acted it out and became monsters ourselves. We acted out the story and thought up other ways monsters might move or what they might do. We re-read the story and even sang it as a song before designing our own monster and writing what they did, e.g. crunch or eat and sneeze. Some of us learned how to use a sound card and others practised writing our names on our work by using a name card.

Our number of the week this week is number 5, we counted forwards and backwards, jumped up and down 5 times and even checked our hands had 5 fingers. We have been practising to count objects making sure we get the right number. we have learnt different ways to help us such as touching each object and moving the objects as we count them. Can you count things around your house? We wonder how many cans of soup you have? or how many teddy bears you have?

In phonics we have been practising the sounds we already know by hunting for our matching sound friend. We had to make the sound on our card and hunt for someone making the same sound. We have learned 4 new sounds this week, ck (which often comes at the end of the word) e, f and ff. We practised sounding these out and segmenting (sounding out) words and blending them back together. We have also learned two new tricky words 'to' and 'the'. See if you can spot these words when you are out and about.



What have we been doing this week?

What a way to start our topic! The children had a surprise bonfire on Monday 29th October. They wrapped up warm and enjoyed campfire songs and a biscuit whilst listening to the sounds the fire made. Thank you very much for supplying gloves, hats and scarves for the event. The children came up with a variety of words to describe how the fire looked, sounded and smelt. They then sorted their words in a zone of relevance to show which words they thought were fantastic to describe the fire. The children are using their word banks to create their own fire and firework poems at the end of this week.

In Maths the children have been counting in 10s. Using multiples of 10, (e.g. 10, 20, 30) the children have identified how many tens there are in each number and what digits these numbers are made from. The children have then been finding ten more and ten less than a multiple of 10 and solving problems using their knowledge of 10s.

In Science the children have been investigating materials. They have been on a material hunt around the school and discussed what different objects are made from and why. Have a look out and about at the weekend to see what materials your children can spot in your environment

5, 4, 3, 2, 1...BLAST OFF!

Thank you so much for the huge amount of effort that was put in by you at home to ensure we had a year group of astronauts on Tuesday! The children looked fantastic and they enjoyed a day of Space-themed activities.

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We have started learning about Neil Armstrong and we wrote a newspaper report about the first time someone walked on the Moon. We made space rockets and discussed what we would like to learn about Space.

In English, we are reading a story called 'Man on the Moon'. We made predictions about the story; it will be interesting to learn whether any of them were right! We have designed our own Space lunch and described it using noun phrases. We have been counting forwards and backwards in jumps of 2, 5 and 10, in Maths.

We checked our Longitudinal Study and drew a labelled diagram of the current season. We noticed the colours on the trees and also the change in what we were wearing since the last time we did this.

This Christmas the school is taking part in a sponsored Reindeer Run


on 4th December 2018 to raise vital funds to support

Phyllis Tuckwell Hospice Care ...becsuse every day is practicus

Please help us to raise as much money as possible for local Hospice Care, by sponsoring your child to dress up as a reindeer and take part in a fun run to support Phyllis Tuckwell.

Phyllis Tuckwell Hospice Care provides supportive and end of life care for patients and families who are living with an advanced or terminal illness, such as cancer, in West Surrey and North East Hampshire.

The children had an age-appropriate assembly, where they learnt about the work that Phyllis Tuckwell does and how the Raindeer Runs can help support their work. They have been given their sponsorship envelopes to take home to raise as much as possible before the run, which will be held on Tuesday 4th December. Your child needs to bring their envelope back in on the day of the run. The run will be held at the school and the children will be given a set of reindeer antlers to wear whilst taking part, which they can then take home with them afterwards.



As the NHS/Government only covers 20% of Phyllis Tuckwell's costs, it has to raise over £20,000 a day to be able to offer all of its services, which are given free of charge to its patients and their families. It therefore relies heavily on the support and generosity of the local community, who raise money through events such as these reindeer/eff runs.
