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Year R News

What have we been doing this week?

This week we have been learning about Diwali. This is the festival of lights and Hindu's celebrate it. We have learned about the traditional celebration leading up to and around Diwali such as decorating the front of your house with colourful patterns (rangoli patterns) and having Mehndi patterns painted onto your hands. In classes we have been making our own Diwali lanterns, Diva lamps and designing our own rangoli patterns using pasta and peg boards.

In phonics we have learned our last few Phase 2 sounds I, II and ss. We have started to recap all of the sounds we have learnt so far to ensure we are secure on them all. We will start having a bigger focus on being able to correctly write the sounds as well as saying them. Challenge yourself at home to write the sounds you know, you could help write a shopping list.

In maths we have started to look at 1 more than a number. We have been finding a number and adding 1 more to it in lots of different ways. For example, we have helped a ladybird out by adding 1 more spot to her back.

Our number of the week this week is number 7, can you spot 7 things around your home? Maybe you have 7 teddies on your bed or 7 peas on your plate.

Things to talk about this week: Can you discuss the celebrations you celebrate as a family whether it is birthdays or a religious celebration. Please talk to the children about why you do this in your family and what makes it special. Let us know what special celebrations you celebrate in your family, we would love to hear.

What have we been doing this week?

This week Year 1 have been reading, writing and solving addition number sentences in Maths. Guy Fawkes wanted to stack different amounts of barrels in two boats to get them across the river. Some children needed to find the total amount of barrels he had in his two boats. Other children had to find as many different ways as they could for him to split an amount of barrels into two boats. Next week we will be continuing our problem solving journey using subtraction. I wonder if you could practise taking 1 item away from different groups of items at home? Then try to take 2 away?

ear 1 News

In English the children have been investigating what words and punctuation they need to write a diary. They found capital letters, the word 'I', finger spaces, conjunctions (and, because) and full stops were used in a diary we read in class. The children will be planning diary entries towards the end of this week, pretending they are Guy Fawkes during the Gunpowder Plot.

In PE the children have been using the apparatus in the hall to make and hold gymnastic shapes. They have all remembered the five different shapes and have been experimenting using them on the wall bars, benches, mats and beams.

In Computing this week the children have been looking at greetings cards we might send to one another at a time of celebration. They designed a greetings card that they would like to send to someone at home. Over the next few weeks we will be using different skills to publish their designs using a computer.









<u>Year 2 News</u>

What have we been doing this week?

In English, the main character in our key text is called Bob. Bob asked us to create a set of instructions for him to make a Space lunch. We made a sandwich; thinking carefully about the steps needed for a set of instructions. We sequenced the steps using pictures and key words. We wrote the instructions and then had a go at editing our work.

The children have been learning to divide in Maths this week; using sharing and grouping. We have drawn diagrams and used apparatus to help us to understand what division means. As we progress through the week, we will move on to using repeated subtraction to find the answer to division problems. Can you share items equally at home this week? Perhaps your child could share out 10 toys for 2 people.

In Art, the children made four different design ideas for their wax-resist pictures and practised using the technique in preparation for their final piece. Also in Topic lessons, the children worked in groups to research information about the Solar System using books and the Internet. They presented the information that they found to the class. In gymnastics, we have been using different ways of travelling to link our gymnastic shapes together and begun to compose our own sequences.
