What have we done this week?

Read below to find out what your child has been doing this week and ask them/talk to them about what they have been up to.

What have we been doing this week?



This week Year R have been learning all about post. We started the week by receiving a special parcel in the post; a story called 'Paddington's Post'. The children have enjoyed lots of Paddington themed activities such as painting bears, labelling pictures, writing letters and post cards and becoming post office workers and postal delivery workers in the role play area.

In English, we have been learning and writing initial sounds to label pictures, have been practising writing our names and our friends' names so we can send letters to them. We also practised listening to and following instructions to make our very own marmalade sandwiches. They were very sticky but actually very delicious too! We can see why Paddington loves them so much!

In maths, we have been learning to subitise numbers to 3. We have looked at lots of different arrangements of objects and said how many there are without needing to count them. We also tried really hard to show these numbers on our fingers too. Some of us found this a bit tricky. Maybe play some games at home where your children can practise showing different amounts on their fingers.

Next week, we will continue our learning about post and Paddington and will be preparing for our walk to the postbox. Please let your child's class teacher know if you are able to support with this and can spare a little time to help us on our walk.

What have we been doing this week?

Wow! What amazing Poetry performances Year 1. Thank

you for helping the children to learn their poem for the performance. They all looked very professional when sharing these in assembly! Today, we have been looking at a book called 'Nature Trail' and have been enjoying looking at the poem and creating the images that we see when we read it.

In the rest of our English this week, we have started reading a new story called 'On my Papa's Shoulders' all about a little boy walking to school. In the story, we learn about what he can see on the journey and what he enjoys. Can your child retell the story to you? It would be great if you could talk about your own journey to school. What do you pass? What can you see?

In our maths work, we have continued learning about splitting wholes into parts. We have now moved on from looking at objects to numbers. We have been

thinking about how we could split the number 5 into parts. What about if we had to split it into 3 parts? How could we split the number 12? The children have been recording this using a part, part whole model and have worked really hard to use their number knowledge.

Over the last few weeks in science, we have been learning about different materials and trying to locate these around the school. We have found fabric, wood, metal, plastic and ceramic. This week we looked at why certain materials are good at their jobs and if they are suitable for the purpose. We talked about why saucepans are not made of wood and why plates are not made of fabric. Could you go on a material hunt around your house?

We are continuing to collect any textile scraps or buttons so if you have any donations please bring them in.

What have we been doing this week?

Year 2 have been getting creative in English lessons

this week, by bringing to life the story of owl in his tree through the seasons. The children acted out different scenes from the story in order to write sentences from Owl's perspective. We have seen some wonderful vocabulary used as a result! The children have continued to improve their reasoning skills in maths. They have shown different ways of representing a number and used a variety of resources to explain their understanding.

Topic has seen Year 2 bring together their understanding and knowledge of the weather in the UK, by learning how settlements are adapted for different types of weather. We looked at the school and our local area and explored adaptations made in our environment when the weather changes throughout the year.

We have also had the opportunity to learn more about the NSPCC, by engaging in a workshop. We learnt about identifying our worries and sharing with a trusted adult when we feel worried. We learnt how important it is to not keep our worries inside, but to get help from people we trust.

Monday 30th October - Hook Day for new topic, 'Castles'. Dress up as a king, queen, knight, dragon or any other 'castle' based character!















Beyond the Gate - Forest School

On Tuesday, some of the Year 2 children of Robin and Woodpecker class had the chance to practise their fire striking skills. They revisited their learning about the fire triangle and the correct position to be in when lighting fires from Year 1. They then used flint and steels to create a spark, before lighting a small piece of tinder (cotton wool).

Badger class had a fun afternoon, continuing to consider how they stay safe at Forest School, through different games and activities. They then had plenty of important free exploration and play.

Mrs Dear is committed to her Continued Professional Development as a Forest School Leader. At the weekend, she attended the Forest School Association Annual Conference where she learnt more advanced practical skills (knife skills; willow weaving, advanced rope & slacklines and practising more delicious food to cook over a fire). She was introduced to up-to-date research and knowledge about the natural world and nature connection. As well as spending the time connecting, networking and learning from other Forest School Leaders; Ceilidh dancing with 250 + people, relaxing in hammocks and around fires and admiring the beauty of nature. What an amazing weekend - she is looking forward to imparting her new knowledge and skills onto the children!
