For reading we will be continuing to encourage the children to sound out words to read CVC words. We will be consolidating the sounds we have already learned and will then be moving on to new sounds from phase 3. We will also read various books as a class, discussing the story and the characters and making predictions about what we think will happen next. In writing, we will continue to practise name writing, using the correct letter formation and encouraging children to write the initial sound in words, extending to CVC words using the sounds they have been taught. We will also continue to practise tricky

Communication and Language

We will be learning new words relating to various celebrations from around the world. We will continue to practise speaking in full sentences and will be working on showing understanding of questions by answering 'why' questions. We will also practise our speaking skills in class, talking about our own experiences of different celebrations and family traditions.

Physical Development

To develop our gross motor skills, we will continue with our weekly PE sessions when we will be joining in with various games that involve balance, coordination and moving our bodies in a variety of ways. For our fine motor control we will explore lots of different activities that make our hands and fingers work hard such as scissor control, playdough, tweezers and even some pumpkin carving!

Understanding the World

We will be looking closely at family traditions for our communities, people and cultures strand and exploring the natural world around us with autumnal items. We will also be learning about the Christmas story with our upcoming Christmas Nativity!

Mathematics

We will continue developing a deeper understanding of numbers to 10, through subitising, comparing groups, practising counting with accuracy using 1:1 correspondence and also understanding the composition of numbers, using the language 'part' and 'whole'. We will also be using spatial language to talk about and describe shapes.

Personal, Social, Emotional Development
