What have we done this week?

What have we been doing this week?



In Year R we have continued with our topic of festivals, this week learning about Diwali. The children explored different objects linked to Diwali, finding out lots of interesting facts about the Hindu festival of light. We explored the different traditions which are followed, learning about this through the eyes of a Hindu child.

The children thoroughly enjoyed learning about the story of Rama and Sita, and we all had a go at a very energetic Diwali dance routine. Throughout explore and learn time, the children have enjoyed making their own rangoli patterns and creating henna art (don't worry we used paper hand templates not our actual hands!) We also enjoyed using clay to make our own diva lamps, then we used paint and glitter to decorate them.

Thank you to those parents who joined for the Maths workshops, it has been great to hear how much the children have been playing their games at home. In Maths this week we have been exploring the number 5, practising counting and using the song '5 Little Peas' to help us understand the composition of the number. Can you show your grown up how many different ways we can make the number 5?

What have we been doing this week?

This week in Year 1 we have been finishing our designs for our own enormous bus inspired by the Hundred Decker Bus story. The children are very proud of their designs and have written information posters using full stops and capital letters. Can your child tell you all about their incrdible bus design?

In maths, we have continued using our part, part, whole models to partition numbers. We have now started representing the numbers on a bar model as well. The children have got really good at identifying how they need to split the bar into the appropriate sizes.

We hope you have enjoyed playing the maths games for homework. This week we will be sending a new game home to play. These are fantastic ways to help build children's number knowledge and fluency and all the practice really helps. This week, we have also started rehearsing for our Christmas performance and costume letters should have made their way home to you. if there are any concerns, please speak to your child's class teacher.

What have we been doing this week?



Owl Class and Woodpecker Class enjoyed a windy, but wonderful, trip to Portchester Castle, where they learnt lots about castle life and those that lived there.

In maths, we have been learning to add two-digit and 1-digit numbers, using different apparatus, structured and unstructured numberlines. We are also looking forward to the next maths mastery lesson with parents on Friday morning at 9am.

We finished writing our fantastic 'George and the Dragon' stories, this week. We worked on including exclamatory sentences and we edited our spelling and punctuation errors. We have also considered which jobs we would have done if we'd lived in a castle and we wrote about the types of activities we would have completed.

In science, we are exploring materials. We carried out an experiment to determine which paper would be strong enough to be used as wrapping paper. We made predictions and explained our thoughts.

Beyond the Gate - Forest School

Last Thursday, the Year 2 groups spent time reflecting on Remembrance Day. They admired the single poppy which is still blooming in our site and discussed why poppies are used as a sign of remembrance the children were able to share what they had learnt in their class-rooms.

Each group had the task of creating a large poppy, using natural foraged resources including leaves, acorns, grass and mud! They looked brilliant and gave a nice focal point at the end of the sessions, when Mrs Dear read two Remembrance poems. Some children chose to use tools (the bow saw, nails and hammers) to create a few Remembrance crosses.

The year 2's have also been interested in seeing fungi appearing around the site – especially on our Big Log which they usually climb on. Following this interest, Mrs Dear themed this week's sessions on mushrooms! She bought in a selection of different ones for the children to touch & dissect. They have been learning the scientific words for the parts and how they are different to plants.

Some children choose to be artistic by drawing observational pictures of the different fungi – and some even labelled the parts.

The Year 1 classes have been enjoying their first sessions in the site – and been relishing the opportunities to play in the mud (the "swamp", the "digging area" and the "mud kitchen"). It has been lovely seeing them running around the site, discovering the different areas and where different paths lead to. Of high importance in these initial sessions, is developing their own ability to identify risks and how they can reduce the risk – hopefully they can tell you some of the ways we stay safe when Beyond the Gate.
