Storytelling Week

This week the children have been celebrating Storytelling Week. They have enjoyed hearing the stories, 'My Mum is a Lioness' and 'My Dad is a Grizzly Bear' by Swapna Haddow, as well as taking part in a virtual storytelling event with the Author. The children have used these texts to think about their own version, choosing an animal to compare to a member of their family.

On Tuesday the children had 'Open the Book' come to visit, who told a Biblical story using some very interesting props! The children also enjoyed a Storytelling Assembly in which they joined in with a dramatisation of 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' as well as enjoying a story about a very hungry worm who turned into a rabbit! We talked about how you don't always need books for stories, you can make them up and base them on a story you already know.

On Wednesday some of the Year 2 children went to Bourley Grange Care Home to share stories with the residents. The residents were very impressed with the children's reading!

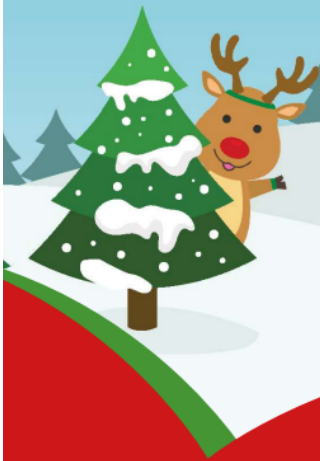

Year R News

This week, Year R have been looking at real life superheroes and jobs where people help others. The children have enjoyed exploring the role of doctors, nurses, firefighters, police, vets and dentists. They have learnt all about the importance of brushing their teeth and even got to practise brushing a giant set of teeth!

For story telling week, we have read the stories 'My Dad is a Grizzly Bear' and 'My Mum is a Lioness' by Swapna Haddow. The children explored the characteristics of different animals and each class wrote a version of the story called 'My Teacher is a...' The children came up with some great characteristics to describe their teachers!

Next week we will be learning about Chinese New Year celebrations and are looking forward to our Chinese Dance Workshop on Wednesday 7th February.

Year 1 News



This week in Year One we have enjoyed creating our own stories as part of Storytelling Week. We started the week reading the book 'My Dad is a Grizzly Bear'. The children have enjoyed thinking about the different adjectives they would use to describe different animals and then considered which were the most appropriate. They have then chosen their own family member and created a character to go somewhere exciting with them. Can your child tell you about their character and where they went?



In maths, we have been working hard on learning how the numbers between 11 to 20 can be partitioned into tens and ones e.g $13 = 1 \text{ ten and } 3 \text{ ones}$. We have been creating these teens numbers practically. We have also been looking at odd and even numbers and doubling numbers up to 10. On your journey to school can you look at door numbers and decide if they are odd or even?



We have been looking at the artist Yaya Kusama and have learnt that she created her images using dots. The children have had a go at creating their own images using dots. Next week in school, we will be learning about mental health and everyone's talents. Please could you chat with your child about what makes them unique.

Year 2 News

We have loved Storytelling week in Year 2! On Monday we enjoyed reading the book 'My Mum is a Lioness.' We had lots of fun acting out different animals and we thought about what animals are friends and family are like. We have designed a dream world for our animal and we will be using our ideas to write a story. We have loved looking at each other's amazing imaginative worlds – so many creative boxes and pictures!



In Maths, we have continued to use our knowledge of counting in 2, 5 and 10s to solve division questions and word problems. We have worked hard showing our answers in lots of different ways.



In Art, we are looking at the artist Robert Wyland and we have used watercolours to paint our drawings of under the sea creatures.



Beyond the Gate - Forest School



It is National Storytelling Week and so to begin the sessions Mrs Dear orally told a story about how the robin got it's orangey, red breast (by getting fire from a volcano to warm the other birds up). While she was storytelling, our friendly robin played around us – listening to the story too! Can your child retell the story at home?

Mrs Dear also read some children the story of "Fiery Fox" and some of our parent helpers also read to children during the sessions.



To continue the bird theme, the children had the opportunity to make a bird from clay. They could make it 2d or 3d and then add foraged natural resources to create the feather, beaks, legs, and other features. We loved their creativity!

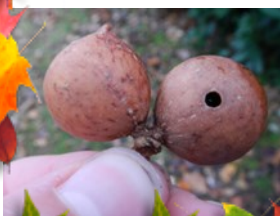


In Robin class, one child has been very interested in making boats over the last few weeks. Following this interest, Mrs Dear provided this class with a range of resources to allow more advanced boats to be made. The children used bark (testing whether their piece would sink or float), drilled holes and added masts and sails. The child who had instigated this

activity thoroughly enjoyed creating his own version of The Titanic! Great child-led learning.

To support the Year 1's science learning about food chains, they had the chance to create food chains for the animals which might be found Beyond the Gate.

In Mole class, the children have been fascinated by the marble oak galls they have been finding. Therefore, this week, Mrs Dear showed them how we could use them to make ink! It needs a week to transform - we wonder if it will work?
