(Easter egg, bottles, toys, teddies)



### **Help with cooking**





### Year R News



We have had a fantastic week in Year R! We continued our learning about springtime by visiting Finkley Down Farm. We were able to see lots of different animals such as sheep, goats, horses and reptiles. We loved brushing the pony and feeding lots of different animals. The soft play was very popular too! Thank you to all of the grown-ups that helped out on the trip.



We used our farm trip to write recounts of the trip using words such as first, next, then to sequence our ideas. We also created our own maps of the farm and used our phonic sounds to label these. We used positional language to decide where we wanted to find each animal e.g the horse is next to the pig. Can you draw a map of your walk to school?



In maths we have used the song 'one, two, three, four, five, once I caught a fish alive' to find different ways of making those numbers. For example, we discussed that you can make 7 with a 5 and a 2. We have also looked at putting the correct amount of animals into the barns and adding these together.



We can't wait for another great week of learning next week.

### Year 1 News

This week in Year 1, we have boarded the train and started our journey along the tracks. In English, we have been reading the story 'The Runaway Train'. The children have been learning how to adapt root words by adding the suffix -'ing' and the prefix 'un-'. They have created words such as undo, unzip, unhappy and speeding, zooming and jumping. The children have then used these to write a diary entry in role as Duffy the Train Driver.



In maths, we have been learning all about coins. The children have been recognising 1p, 2p, 5p and 10p and finding the total amount of money indifferent purses. The children had great fun in our classroom shop where they role played buying amounts using the different coins. It was great to see the children working out how to use different coins to create a total.



The children have been developing their paint skills on the laptops and have been developing their skills to change the brush size, style and colour. Additionally, they have been adding in shapes and text. As part of our All Aboard learning, we have been learning about George Stephenson, who he is and what he was known for. Can your child tell you some facts about him? They were very excited to learn about how long ago in the past he was born using our timeline.

### **Year 2 News**

In English this week we have had fun creating wanted posters for one of the Queens we have been studying. We have enjoyed using our imagination and were able to use some really interesting vocabulary to engage the reader.



In Maths we have been continuing with our work on fractions, we have been learning to recognise and find a third of shapes and quantities.



In History we were able to sort pictures of inventions and events that happened during each Queen's reign and had a good discussion about each one. We loved looking at the clothes worn and finding out how the first TV looked and worked!



We are really looking forward to our first Fix It Friday session this week and can't wait to get stuck into a project.



## **Beyond the Gate - Forest School**

The weather for our Beyond the Gate sessions seems to be totally different on Tuesdays and Thursdays this half term! The Tuesday classes are getting the dry weather, and the Thursday classes the rain (British weather in all its' glory!).

If they wish to, the children have been getting involved with making products to sell at the PTFA Spring Fayre (Sat 23<sup>rd</sup> March). This week, some children have been busy painting tin cans to make into bug habitats. Other children continued to paint the outside of bird boxes. It has been lovely to see their creativity.





Recently, the Men's Shed made us some multipurpose stands and Mrs Dear managed to get hold of some guttering. This equipment has been a hit, with groups of children working together to create different water struc-

tures and enjoying pouring water. Without realising they are applying their science and maths learning and the discussions they have been having while playing with these resources has been so rich.

One child in Kingfisher class commented that the Minibeast Skyscraper, which we built in the summer, did not have a sign. So, Mrs Dear provided him with a piece of wood and, with a friend, he made a brilliant sign for it. What a great child-led opportunity.



The children have been learning (or for year 2 revisiting learning) about Lords'n'Ladies - or cuckoo pint - which are beginning to grow in abundance. They are a toxic plant and so the children have been learning how to identify them (by looking for the vein which goes around the edge of the leaf). By helping them identify these plants, they can apply their own risk assessments when exploring and know not to touch them. We want to keep them growing as Blackbirds and Thrushes love eating the berries in the Autumn!
