Dressing for Beyond the Gate

It is important that the children are dressed appropriately for their Beyond the Gate sessions – especially at the moment, where the site is very muddy and wet. Your child needs a full change of clothes for their session and spare socks or tights.

If they are using their school coat it is very likely to get muddy.

We only have limited spare kit, and because it is being used by lots of children, it gets very muddy, wet and ripped and we are unable to dry it between morning and afternoon sessions. Therefore, please try to provide clothing for your child. If you are struggling, please take a look in the "help yourself" box in the front entrance or speak to your class teacher directly.



Your child needs:

- Long sleeved T-shirt style top (as a base layer)
- Long jogging bottoms or leggings (as a base layer)
- Warm jumper or fleece (to go over base layer)
- Waterproof trousers (or an all-in-one waterproof suit)
- Warm, waterproof coat (if this is their school coat, it will get muddy!)
- Waterproof gloves
- Thick, warm socks
- Winter hat, scarf and waterproof gloves
- Wellington boots or waterproof walking boots
- Spare socks or tights incase water goes in their wellies during the session

What have we done this wee **Year R News**

What have we been doing this week?

What an EGG-citing week we've had in Reception! Our classrooms have been filled with lots of excitement as we welcomed our newest fluffy friends – ducklings! We have been busy learning how to care for them with gentle hands and have been enjoying observing every moment.

During Explore and Learn time, we've been learning all about animal life cycles and matching baby animals to their adults. And to add a touch of creativity, we had a go at experimenting with sketching various animals, letting our imaginations run wild on the page, we are great artists!

In Maths we started the week by subitising arrangements of 6. We then discussed how we knew it was 6 and was not 6. After we moved on to ordering quantities up to 10, using various objects during explore and learn to consolidate our understanding. And of course, we couldn't forget about World Book Day! Dressed up as Colour Monsters, we explored a rainbow of emotions and shared why we have chosen that feeling. We then listened to different Colour Monster stories in all Reception classes. What a lovely week we have had!

What have we been doing this week?

This week in Year 1 we have been continuing our

writing about 'The Runaway Train'. We started the week by creating 'Lost Train' posters and we tried to include words that contained the suffixes ing, ed, est and er which we have been learning about. When you are reading at home can you spot any of these words? We then used all of our writing skills to create our own version of the story. We have tried hard to remember our full stops, capital letters, finger spaces and our best handwriting.

In maths, we have started learning about fractions. We have been splitting shapes into halves and quarters. We have learned that for it to be a half or quarter, all the parts must be equal. Nobody can have the bigger half! We then looked at sharing an amount into halves and quarters. We started with counters and shared them with a friend to find half of different amounts. Some of us spotted that all the numbers we were halving were even! We tested this theory and found that we couldn't equally halve an odd number.

In our history learning this week, we have been learning more about George Stephenson. We looked at pictures and tried to decide if the objects were from when George Stephenson was alive in the past or from now when we are a live. We were super detectives! We have also enjoyed World Book Day and Bunny Bounce this week! It really has been busy with lots of fun and learning!

In Maths this week we have been looking at and sorting 2D and 3D shapes. We have also looked at their properties and language associated with shape. We have also been drawing accurate lines of symmetry.

What have we done this wee

In English we read 'The Colour Monster goes to school', we identified the different areas we have in school and wrote about how they are used. We had some great discussions about our own very first day at school and shared some funny memories!

World Book Day was great fun, we enjoyed looking at the colourful clothes and visiting different classes to hear stories read.

Woodpecker and Owl classes really enjoyed their trip to Kensington Palace and seeing for themselves where Queen Victoria was born and lived.

Fix-it Friday was fun, we designed a jewellery box fit for a queen!

We had an assembly about enjoying books and special places to read. We have enjoyed listening to stories about monsters including 'The Colour Monster goes to School'. Beyond the Gate - Forest School



With World Book Day being celebrated this week, Mrs Dear themed the sessions around "The Stickman" by Julia Donaldson. She began by reading the story, using her own stickman to act out the events. The children then had the opportunity to make their own stickperson using natural resources, wool and string! The children were very motivated to do this activity - and then excitedly took their



stick people off around the site to go on all kinds of adventures.

Extending the stick theme, Mrs Dear also discussed sticks as being good fuel for a fire. She then



supported children – if they chose to – in learning or practising their fire striking with fire steels. I wonder if your child can show you the safe fire lighting position? The children are always amazed when they produce a spark and show excellent safety understanding.

In our sessions, children are also continuing to make items for selling at the Spring Fayre. Some children have been learning how to use a hack saw to cut bamboo sticks ready

to use in the tin can bug habitats. To do this, they had to use a ruler to accurately measure 9cm before sawing.



Some children in Kingfisher class made a big puddle lake, we then observed them using mud to build up "walls or dams" around it, to stop the water escaping. Their teamwork was impressive and without realising they were learning so much.



Another group of children had great fun jumping into the pond. They took it in turns and, before they jumped, checked with everyone close by that it was okay for them to jump in, demon-


strating that they were looking after each other (one of our Forest School rules!).
