Year R News

What have we been doing this week?

We started Monday morning off with a special letter from 'Mollie Monster' she asked us about the things she could hear and see in the sky over the weekend. She asked if we knew what they were and if we could find out for her. We discussed that the lights and noises were fireworks and watched a video to come up with the words that describe fireworks e.g. bang, pop, whizz etc... We also thought about what colours the fireworks were.



This week in phonics we have been learning the sounds h, b, f, ff. We have learned the songs and actions for these and practiced reading them in words such as; hat h-a-t, bug b-u-g, puff, p-u-ff. We made sure we knew the sounds in each words by breaking them down (segmenting) before we blended them back together. We have started to look at the sounds we are learning in a sentence and having a go at using our sound knowledge to read them, e.g. The big bed is red. Our tricky words this week are; I, no, go. See if you can spot them in your bedtime story.



In our maths we have looked at the importance of zero, we found out that it means there is nothing. The cookie monster has helped us find out what happens if we take away everything meaning we have none left.



Our number of the week is number 6, we have practiced counting up and back to it, we have looked for the number out and about and even found ways to make it. Can you spot any 6's at home? Maybe you could send us a photo on Tapestry.



Things to talk about this week: fireworks and words starting with h, b, f and ff.

Year 1 News

What have we been doing this week?

Year 1 have been learning about historical events behind the celebrations of bonfire night in English and History lessons this week. The children have sequenced the events which led up to that famous date in 1605. They have role-played visiting Parliament and meeting King James I. They have talked about how people might have felt during the days leading up to the gunpowder plot. They have been thinking of vocabulary to describe how Guy Fawkes might have felt during the plot. The children will be using the words to help them get into the character of Guy Fawkes when writing a gunpowder plot diary in the next few weeks.



In Maths the children have been counting in 2s. The children have been counting how many eyes were in the classroom to help them count in twos. How many eyes are in your house at home? Can you count them in 2s?



In Science the children have been describing the physical properties of a material they have found around the classroom. Thank you for your homework this week. You have used fantastic detective skills looking for materials around your own homes.





Year 2 News

What have we been doing this week? Another week of Space exploration has flown by for our little astronauts in Year 2!



Can your child tell you something about Tim Peake? We have been learning about him and his achievements this week. We have explored what humans need to survive and what they need to eat in order to stay healthy. We have learned about the different food types and about having a balanced diet. In English, we looked at a good set of instructions and picked out the key features. We have also been learning to use commas in a list. Can you spot any commas in shared reading at home? The next part of our English learning journey will be sequencing sentences using time adverbials such as; later, next, after lunch and finally bedtime. We will also be learning to write exclamatory sentences. These are sentences which start with 'What' or 'How' and end with an exclamation mark. For example: What a wonderful week we have had!





Maths has been all about multiplication and looking at different ways of recording our answers. Can your child show you what an array is? We learnt that the multiplication symbol means 'groups of' and that multiplication is the same as repeated addition. We have started practising our 2, 5 and 10 times tables with songs.
