# A MESSAGE FROM MRS TOTTEM

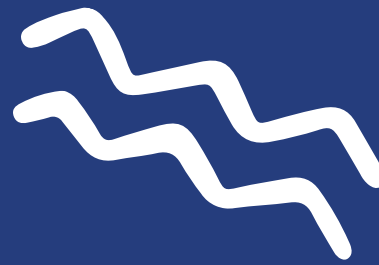

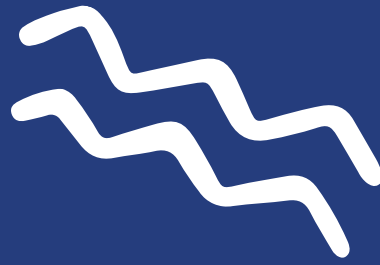
## **360 SPORTS EDUCATION - HALF TERM CAMP**

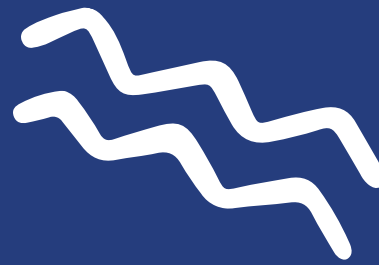
## **HEDGEHOG CLASS ASSEMBLY**

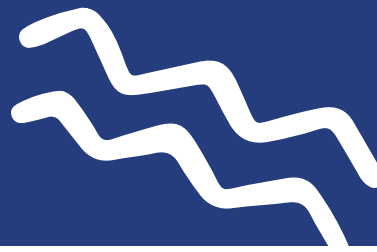
## **LATE COLLECTION**

# RECEPTION

This week in English the children have been enjoying the book 'Field trip to the Moon'. On Tuesday they even had a visit from a real alien, who had travelled all the way from planet Zorg! The children thoroughly enjoyed asking the alien the questions they had come up with. They then wrote about the alien using some fantastic vocabulary!

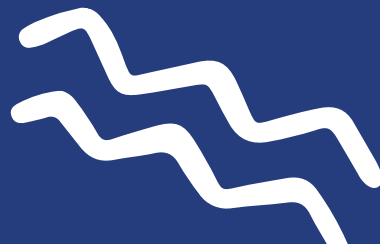
In Maths this week we have been exploring different ways of making five. We sang the song, 'Five Little Kittens Jumping on the Bed' and used counters to act out the song. In Design and Technology, the children have been making rocket sliders to add to their space background. They drew rockets and stuck them onto paper or lolly sticks. They then cut a line into their background to make a slot to move their rocket across space. In Music, the children listened to 'Cat Duet', they then explored using different voices for different characters, playing a singing game with mood changes and copying short rhythmic patterns.

We were very fortunate to have a visit from Nate's dad who talked to us about the lunar model. The children enjoyed asking questions and finding out about the world around them.

We hope you all have a safe and happy half term! Next half term our topic is 'What a Wonderful World'.



# YEAR 1

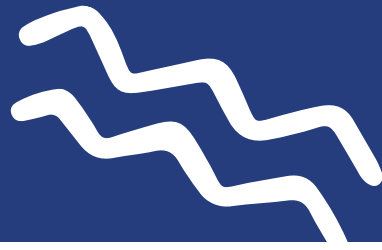


Year One had a very exciting half term and we have loved our topic learning 'Faster than a Rocket'. The children have enjoyed finding out about Neil Armstrong and his mission to the moon on Apollo 11. We have loved reading a range of stories linked to space and this week have read the book 'Field Trip to the Moon.' In this story, some aliens told the story of how they watched some earthling children arrive on the moon for a school trip and unfortunately one child was left behind! The children have written postcards imagining they were on the school trip to the moon. We have also created our very own Top Trumps cards to show the aliens that were spotted on the moon. The children found this great fun imagining the alien they saw and the features they had. They really enjoyed sharing these with friends!

In maths, we have been learning all about weight and mass. The children explored the classroom and school grounds to find an item that they considered to be light and then an item they could find that was heavier. The children were particularly creative finding leaves, flowers, toys, water bottles, chairs and books. We then introduced the children to balance scales and the children learned how to compare the weight of a range of items using the scales. The children then organised their items into order from lightest to heaviest. We then introduced the children to using cubes to weigh the items and children made predictions about how many cubes they think each item would weigh. The children have been super at using their investigative skills to explore weight and mass.

In RE, we finished our learning on light, and the children have explored how they feel in the dark and in the light. We discussed times that we can feel excited in the dark such as waiting for a film to start at the cinema or when we are camping with our families. We discussed how candlelight can make us feel comforted, warm, calm and relaxed. The children were relaxed and calm watching the candle flicker. In DT, we have completed our levers and sliders creations and children have used their designing, folding and cutting skills to create these super projects. To finish our history learning, we have looked at the significance of Neil Armstrong's moon landing and what it has meant for space exploration today. Many of the children felt that the fact that we have recently been back to the moon with Artemis II showed that Neil Armstrong's landing was significant.

# YEAR 1 CONTINUED



Please support your child with their home learning this half term. We have sent home some alien and real words for children to practise their phonics skills in preparation for the screening. Please can we ask you to continue supporting the learning of the common exception words that we recently sent home. The highlighted words are those that your child needs to practise. In the second half of the summer term, we will be ensuring the children can spell the days of the week and the months of year. Any practise you can give your children and to support their learning of these will be greatly appreciated. We hope that all children and families have a great half term and come back for the second half of Summer Term rested and ready to go for their last half term in Year One.

# YEAR 2

What a busy half term we've had, learning all about our Aussie pals down under and how their life in Sydney compares to Fleet and Winchester. The children have finalised their learning, by writing an information leaflet to persuade others to visit Fleet. It has been wonderful to see them practising phrases such as;

- Many people say...
- I recommend...
- If you're the sporty type, you will love...
- Don't miss the opportunity to visit...
- Come along to...

We are looking forward to seeing how the children bring this knowledge into their acting skills when they become travel presenters at the end of the week.

In Maths, the children have been practising adding and subtracting with money. It has been great to see them become more confident in recognising the coins and note values. We're sure the children would love to tell you all about their knowledge at home. Could they role play shopping with you?

Also, the children have been busy collecting data about 'Walk To School' week. This has linked to our learning in David Attenborough week where the children considered how to be healthy and look after their local environment. We're sure they'll be challenging you to get out and about over the break, either on foot, scooting or biking.

We can't believe it's almost time to start thinking about our end of year celebrations and the transition to junior school! This week, many children enjoyed the opportunity to visit Church Crookham Junior School and meet with Year 3 children to start discussing what junior school life is like. Those children who still await their opportunity to visit their junior school have also been taking part in circle time discussions about the transition. It has been lovely to hear them talk so positively about the upcoming changes; including their special memories of Tweseldown.

We hope you all have a wonderful May half term break and look forward to welcoming you back where we will be jetting off in our aeroplane as the children learn all about the history of flight.

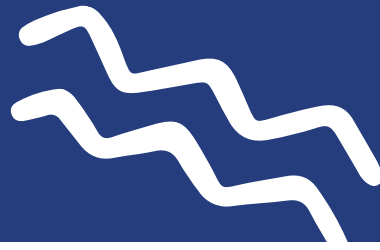

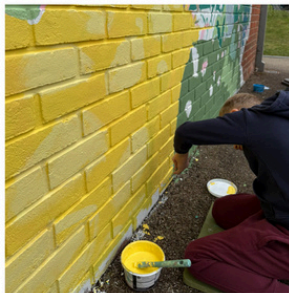
