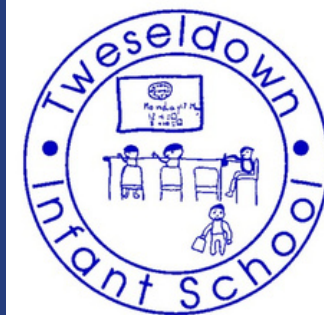
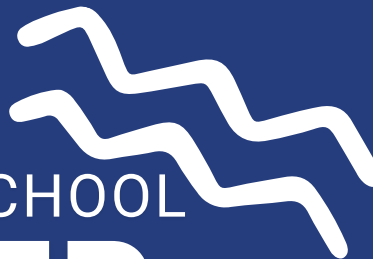

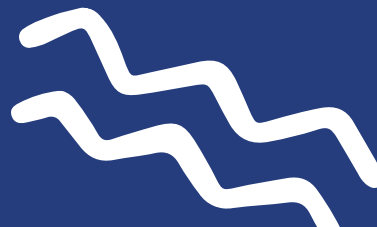

SPORTS DAY

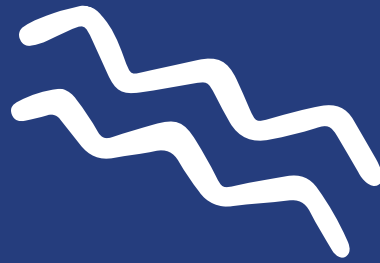
We are looking forward to seeing you tomorrow, Friday 19th June for Tweseldown Sports Day. Children are to wear PE kits all day.

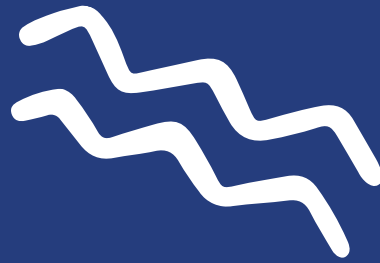

Monday 29th June is an INSET day - The school will therefore be closed to pupils on this day.

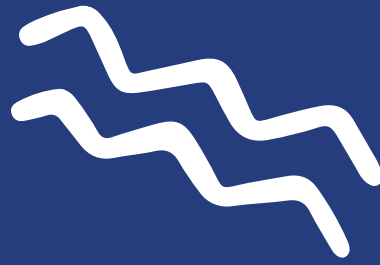

PETER PAN WORKSHOP

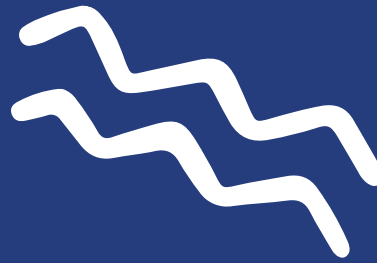
All pupils will be taking part in a Peter Pan Workshop in July. The dates for each year group are listed below;

On Friday 17th July the PTFA have organised a mufti day for the children. Children can come to school on this day in their own clothes.

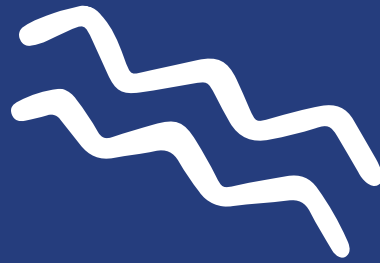
SQUIRREL PARENTS MEETING

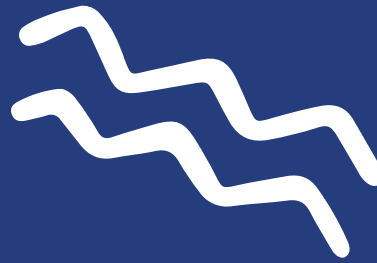
SICKNESS AND DIARRHOEA - 48HR RULE

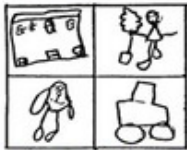

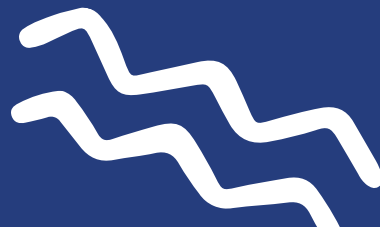

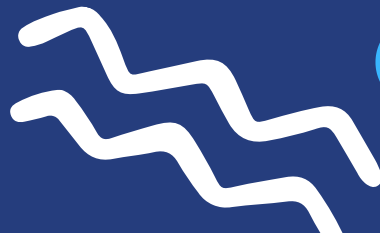
YEAR R BEACH TRIP



YEAR R BEACH TRIP



RECEPTION



This week, we spent time preparing for our class trip to West Wittering. We talked carefully about what would happen during the day and discussed how to stay safe, including listening carefully to adults, staying with our groups, and being sensible near the water. The children shared their ideas and showed great understanding about keeping themselves and others safe.

The big day finally arrived – and what an amazing time we had! The children absolutely loved their visit to the beach. They had lots of fun playing in the sand, building wonderful sandcastles, and even splashing in the sea. There were so many smiles and lots of laughter throughout the day. The children loved having an ice lolly too!! We were extremely proud of how well the children behaved. They listened carefully, followed instructions, and showed such enthusiasm and excitement. They represented the school beautifully!

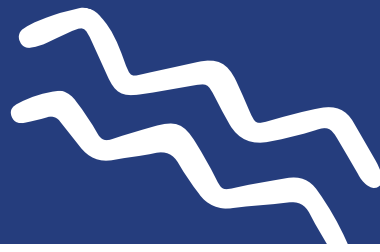
When we returned to school, the learning continued. The children wrote about their trip, recalling all the fun they had and sharing their favourite moments. It was lovely to hear about their experiences and see their confidence grow as they talked and wrote about the day.

In maths this week, we have been using rekenreks to support our understanding of numbers. A rekenrek is a special counting frame with rows of beads, which helps children to visualise numbers and understand how they are made. The children explored how the beads are arranged in groups, helping them to recognise numbers quickly without counting each one individually.

In phonics, we have been focusing on common exception words and digraphs. Common exception words are words that don't always follow the usual phonics rules, such as the, said, you. These need to be recognised by sight, and the children are working hard to remember them. Digraphs are two letters that come together to make one sound, such as sh, ch, th, and ai. The children have been practising reading and writing words containing these sounds.

We have had a great week, and we are looking forward to sports morning tomorrow!

YEAR 1



This week in year 1 we have been reading the book 'What the Macaw Saw'. We have been finding out how people are damaging the homes of Macaws and what makes them sad. We have also learned facts about Macaws such as they have strong, powerful beaks and sleep in trees as a flock. Can your child tell you what they have learned about Macaws?

In maths, we have been learning about 3d shapes. We looked at where we might find these different shapes around the school such as the fridge looked like a cuboid shape. We created models using the different shapes. We have also been learning about the position of objects. We looked at if an object is on top of, next to, under or inside another object.

In preparation for our trip we have been learning all about the rainforest. We learned about the different levels of the rainforest and located the rainforests in an atlas. We thought about what the rainforests would be like and thought about what we would need to pack on a trip to the rainforest. Otter and Deer Class enjoyed their trip to the Living Rainforest and some of us were lucky enough to see a cayman, tortises, monkeys, snakes and even a sloth! We hope Badger and Squirrel are looking forward to their trip next week!

YEAR 2

We have had a busy and exciting time in Year 2 this week, full of learning, creativity and fun!

This week, we have been learning about the inspiring life of Amelia Earhart. The children created their own information pages, exploring her early life and how she became interested in flying, her many achievements (including being the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean) and all of the different ways we remember her today. For example museums, books and her lasting legacy as a pioneer in aviation.

In Maths, we have been focusing on understanding inverse operations (how addition and subtraction are linked). We have been solving word problems, making sure we carefully read the questions to decide what to do. We have also been finding the difference, using number lines and written methods. The children have shown great determination when tackling tricky problems and explaining their thinking.

In DT our lessons have been full of practical skill-building! The children have been practising chopping, grating and peeling. The children worked safely and sensibly while learning these important food preparation skills and they really enjoyed the hands-on experience. They are looking forward to making their own pasta salad next week!

We have also been preparing for our upcoming Sports Day by practising a variety of events, including running races and team activities. The children have shown fantastic teamwork and enthusiasm. We are looking forward to the main event, where they can showcase all their hard work!

Woodpecker and Owls visited the FAST Museum this week and learnt about Samuel Cody, who was a pioneer of early flight. The children discovered who Samuel Cody was and his contributions to aviation. The trip was a wonderful opportunity to bring our learning about flight to life and the children represented the school beautifully.

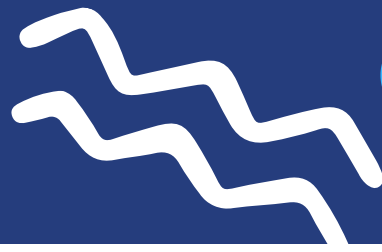

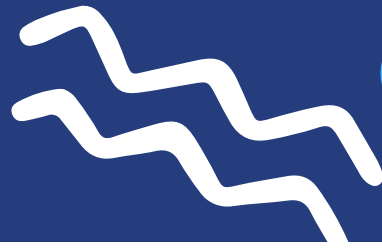

ECO SCHOOLS



Look at this amazing minibeast habitat created by the Eco Committee this week. This will be added to “Attenborough Avenue”.

It was created by filling an old storage box which Mrs Dear had bought in. She explained the term “reuse” and how many things can be turned into something completely different rather than being thrown away. The children filled the container with pine cones, old roof tiles, hay, straw, sticks and even an old storage box for scissors which had the perfect size holes for solitary bees (another example of reusing a product).

After discussion, the children chose to call their microhabitat “Attenborough’s Attic” and started creating a sign for it by hammering nails into the letter shapes.

We can’t wait to see what minibeasts move in!
