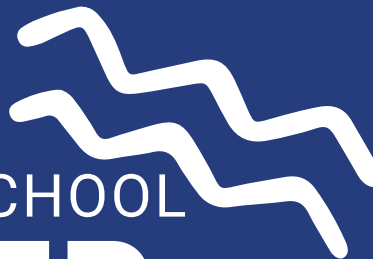

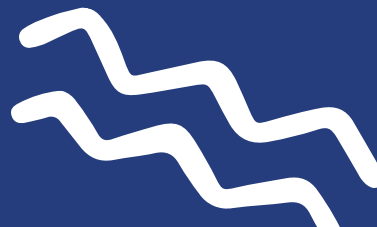

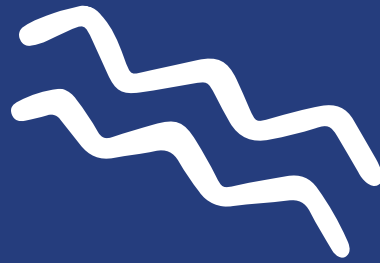

**Monday 29<sup>th</sup> June is an INSET day** - The school will therefore be closed to pupils on this day.

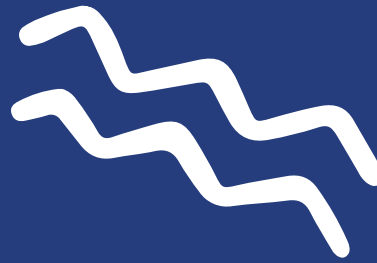
## **YEAR R STARTERS - PARENTS MEETING**

## FLEET CARNIVAL

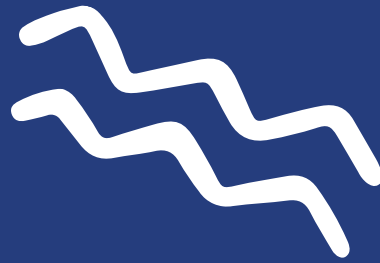
Fleet Carnival is taking place on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> July. Tweseldown meet time is 11:00.

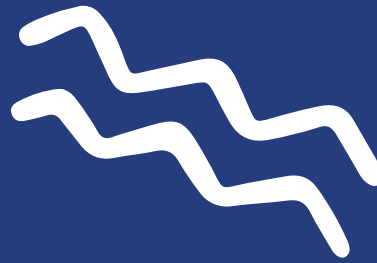
## **PTFA MUFTI DAY**

Robin & Owl class have their leavers assembly on Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> July at 09:00.

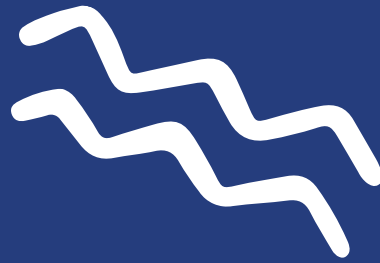
## **LAST DAY OF TERM**

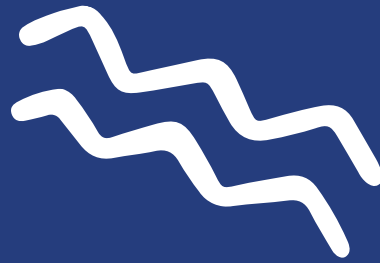
## STARCARE PICK UP TIME

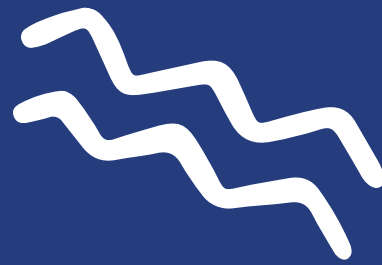


## **A BIG THANK YOU**

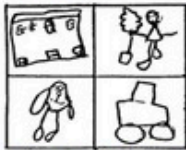

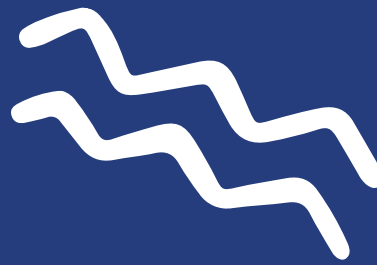

## **HOLIDAY ACTIVITIES AND FOOD (HAF) PROGRAMME**

We would like to provide you with some information on this summer's Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme.

Funded by the Department for Education, the HAF programme enables local authorities to offer healthy food and enriching activities for free to children who receive benefit related FSM during term time.

There will be around 18 HAF schemes running across, or close to, the Hart and Rushmoor areas, with each scheme offering a variety of fun activities and tasty meals for children and young people who receive benefit-related free school meals (FSM).

For summer 2026, a new central booking system has been introduced, which will make it easier for families to find and book HAF activities. The new system includes built-in eligibility checking, so parents / carers no longer need to use the previously issued HAF codes when making bookings.

Families in Hart can visit the [Hart HAF Booking Site](#) to find local schemes and register their interest, whilst families in Rushmoor can visit the [Rushmoor HAF Booking Site](#). Once registered, parents/carers will be sent an automatic email reminder to complete their booking when summer bookings open at 9am on Monday 22 June 2026.

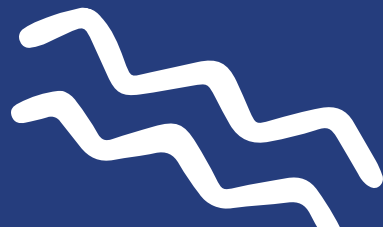

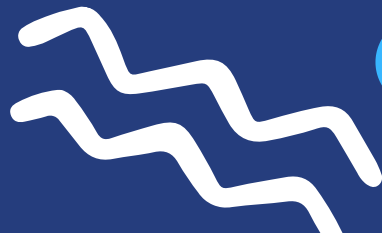

# RECEPTION



What a hot week it has been! The children have done a fantastic job staying focused and engaged in their learning despite the warm weather.

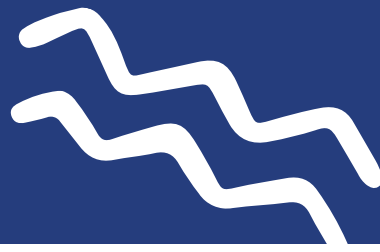
This week, we started our learning by reading 'Little Turtle and the Sea'. The story inspired some wonderful discussions about our environment and how we can help to protect it. We learnt about pollution and talked about the impact it can have on our oceans and sea creatures. Together, we created a list of ways that we can help protect our oceans, we shared some thoughtful and caring ideas.

In our writing, we have continued to work hard on sentence writing. We have been practising using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops, and many children have begun adding adjectives to make their writing even more interesting. We are so proud of their progress.

In Maths, we have been exploring partitioning numbers to 5 and challenging ourselves to partition even larger numbers. We have also been practising writing addition and subtraction number sentences.



# YEAR 1



This week in Year 1 we have been using the book 'Can We Really Save the Polar Bears?' as our focus for writing. We have been thinking about climate change and discussing what we can do to help protect polar bears and their environment. The children shared some fantastic ideas about how we can look after our planet. Can your child tell you one way they could help save the polar bears?

In maths, we have been focusing on money. We have been learning to recognise 20p, 50p, £1 and £2 coins, as well as notes. The children have been exploring how to work out how much money they have in different situations and have been practising using these skills in fun, practical ways.

In art, we have continued learning about the artist Alexander Calder and his sculptures. The children learned that he invented the mobile, like the ones some of us may have at home. They have begun designing and creating their own sculptures of living things using pipe cleaners, showing lots of creativity and imagination.

In science, we have been learning about animals and their structures as part of our What a Wonderful World topic. We looked at X-rays of animal skeletons from both hot and cold environments and discussed different types of animals, including reptiles, mammals and birds. The children were very interested in spotting similarities and differences between them.

Badger and Squirrel Class had a wonderful time visiting the Living Rainforest this week. They enjoyed exploring what a rainforest is like and discovering the amazing variety of animals that live there. It was a fantastic experience and brought our learning to life! Please ask your child what they have enjoyed most this week – we love hearing about their learning at home!

# YEAR 2

What a fantastic week Year 2 have had! Although the weather has been a little on the warm side, the children have shown great resilience and continued to work hard and stay positive throughout. We've made sure to keep cool with regular water breaks and plenty of fresh air or sprinkler breaks, where possible!

In Maths, the children have been busy learning about multiplication and division. They have recapped using arrays to help them understand these important concepts. We have also counted in groups of 2, 3, 5 and 10 to solve problems and this is something you could practise at home. It has been wonderful to see them explain their thinking more clearly.

In English, we finished our information pages about Amelia Earhart and then took a creative turn by gathering exciting verbs for a poem all about flying. The class came up with some brilliant ideas—thinking about how flying vehicles soar, glide, zoom, hover, float, twist and turn. We are looking forward to turning these ideas into poetry next week!

There has also been much excitement as we continue to prepare for our Year 2 Leavers' Assembly. The children have been practising their songs and lines, and we are so proud of the effort they are putting in. We can't wait to share this special performance with you soon. We would really appreciate your support at home by helping your child to practise their lines, as this will build their confidence for the rehearsals.

In RHE lessons, we have been talking about summer safety. We've discussed the importance of staying hydrated, wearing sunscreen, and keeping safe in water so everyone can enjoy the warm weather responsibly. In RE, we have concluded our lessons on 'remembering' and we have talked about how we remember special events in our lives.

We would be very grateful for any small cardboard boxes you may have at home (for example: cereal bar boxes, snack bar boxes, tea bag boxes) to support our upcoming Design and Technology work. Please start bringing these in as soon as possible and no later than next Wednesday.

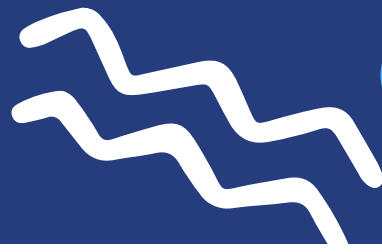

Last week a representative from Veolia, who donated the trees to us, came to school and met with some of our Eco Committee to see where they had planted them and the plans for the development of this area.

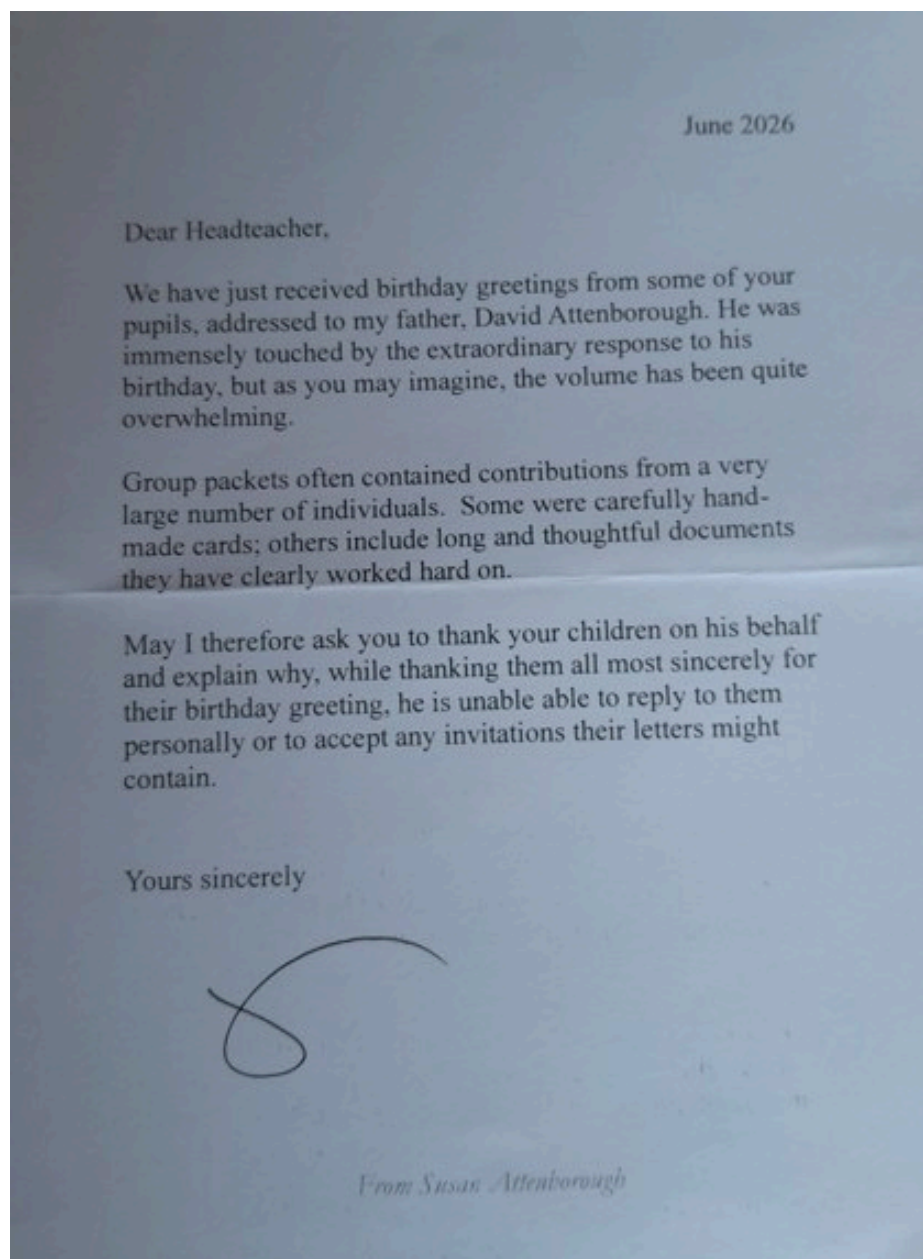
We were excited to spot a small little apple growing on one of them!
