PETER PAN WORKSHOP

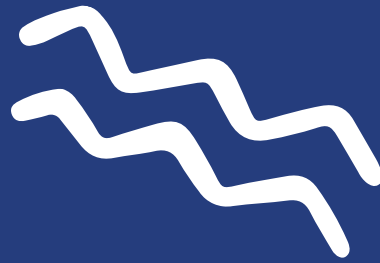
Pupils have been participating in a Peter Pan Workshop this week. We hope the children have enjoyed this. We have one remaining workshop;

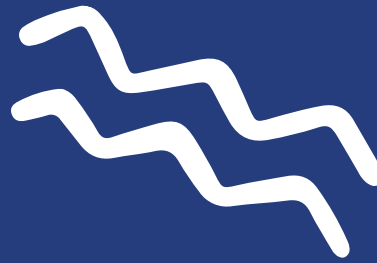

Completed flowers can be dropped off at the school office before Tuesday 21st July or on Tuesday 1st September.



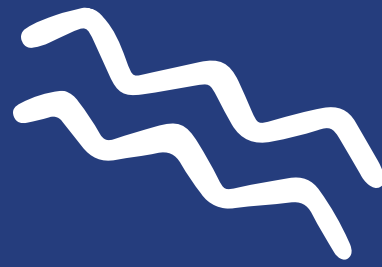
LAST DAY OF TERM

TICKS

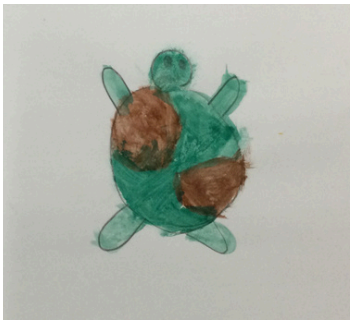

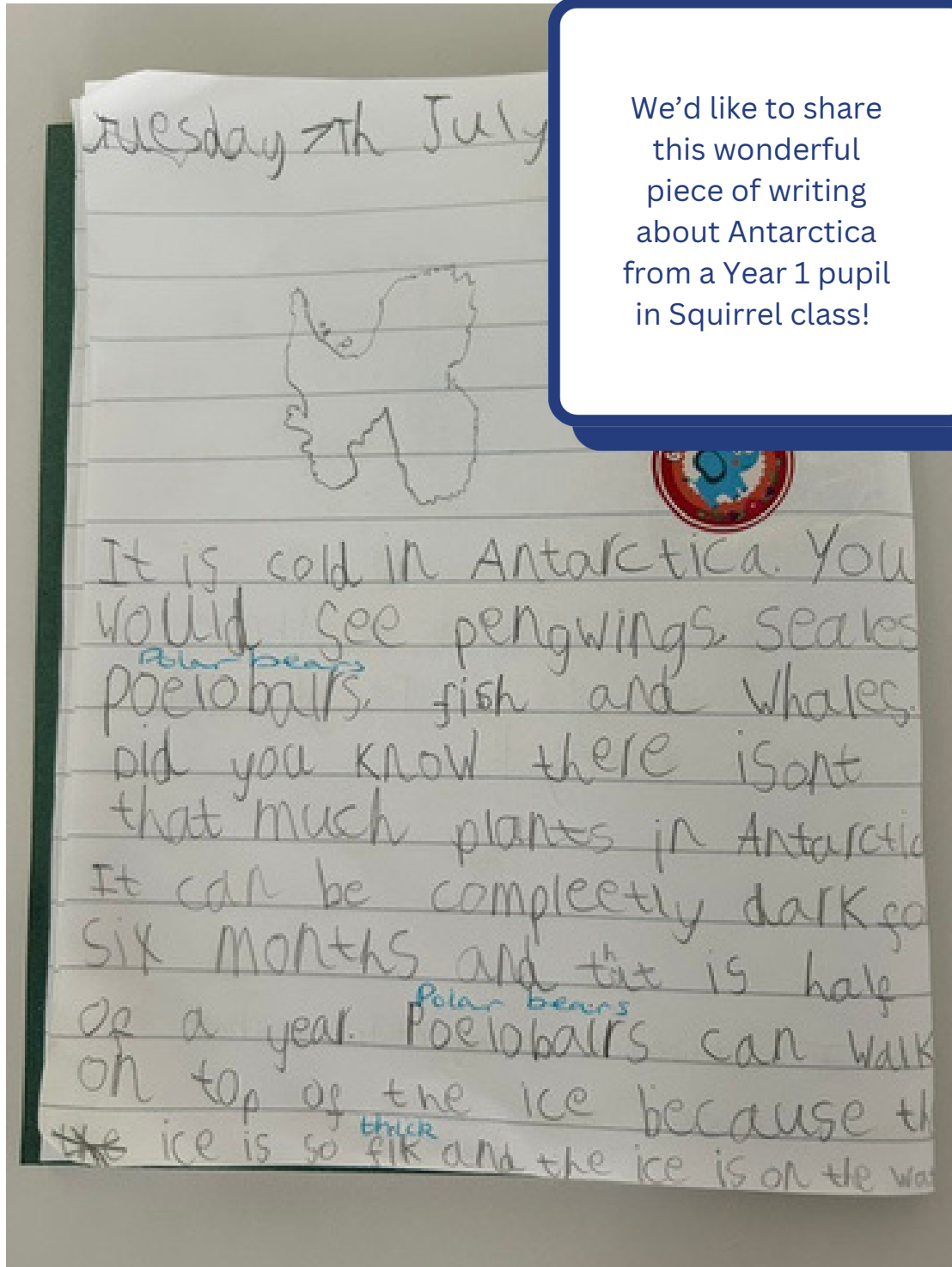
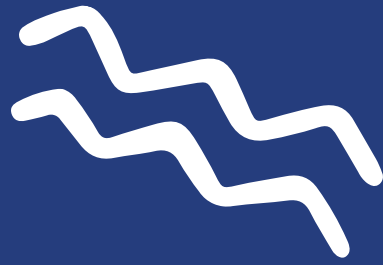
This week at Starcare, the children have been creating some beautiful watercolour pictures - We love the bright colours they've used!



On Tuesday afternoon, the children enjoyed dancing on the stage, complete with pompoms! They had a brilliant time.

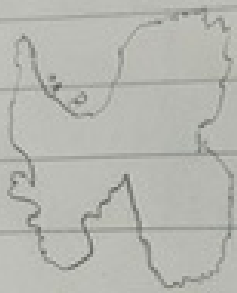

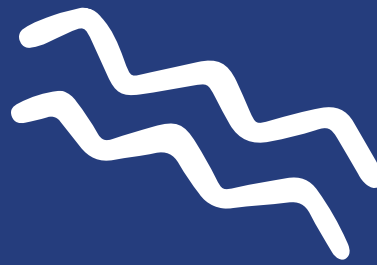
We'd like to share this wonderful piece of writing about Antarctica from a Year 1 pupil in Squirrel class!

HOLIDAY ACTIVITIES AND FOOD (HAF) PROGRAMME

We would like to provide you with some information on this summer's Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme.

Funded by the Department for Education, the HAF programme enables local authorities to offer healthy food and enriching activities for free to children who receive benefit related FSM during term time.

There will be around 18 HAF schemes running across, or close to, the Hart and Rushmoor areas, with each scheme offering a variety of fun activities and tasty meals for children and young people who receive benefit-related free school meals (FSM).

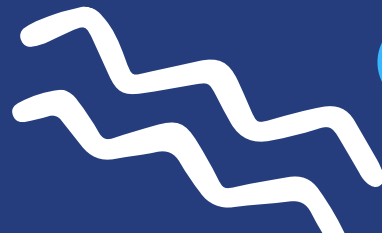
For summer 2026, a new central booking system has been introduced, which will make it easier for families to find and book HAF activities. The new system includes built-in eligibility checking, so parents / carers no longer need to use the previously issued HAF codes when making bookings.

Once registered, parents/carers will be sent an automatic email reminder to complete their booking when summer bookings open at 9am on Monday 22nd June 2026.

RECEPTION



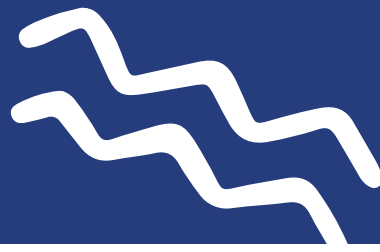
What a wonderful week of learning we have been having in Reception!

Our Drawing Club adventures have taken us beneath the waves as we explored the story 'Commotion in the Ocean'. The children have enjoyed learning exciting new vocabulary, including colossal, graceful, transparent and prey, while developing their speaking, listening skills. Throughout the week, the children have drawn and written about their favourite sea creatures, imagined spectacular underwater worlds, created treasure maps and even invented their own sea creatures! We have also been practising rhyming words and using positional language such as next to, behind and through.

In maths, we have been focusing on comparing quantities to 10. The children have been exploring which groups have more, fewer or the same number of objects. Through practical games, number tracks and rekenreks, they have been developing confidence in recognising and comparing numbers while building a strong sense of number.

As part of science, we have been exploring life beneath the sea. The children have learnt about a variety of ocean animals and discussed how different creatures live in different habitats. We introduced the word 'habitat' and talked about how animals need suitable places to find food, water and shelter. The children enjoyed sorting animals into their correct habitats and discussing why certain animals belong in particular environments.

YEAR 1



This week in Year 1, we have been very busy with our learning!

In **English**, we have been writing letters to our new teacher. We told them all about ourselves, our interests, and what we enjoy at school. We also thought of some thoughtful questions to help us find out more about them. The children worked hard to use their letter-writing skills and remembered to include questions for the reader.

In **Maths**, we have been consolidating our addition and subtraction skills. We have been using our problem-solving abilities to work out missing numbers in calculations and explain how we found our answers. The children have shown great determination and perseverance when tackling these challenges.

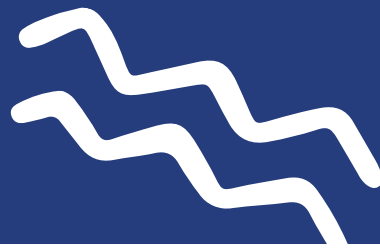
In **Science**, we have been learning about different animal groups, including **mammals, birds, fish, amphibians, and invertebrates**. We have also explored animal diets, identifying **herbivores, carnivores, and omnivores** and discussing the types of food each group eats.

In **Art**, we are putting the finishing touches to our final sculpture pieces inspired by the work of **Alexander Calder**. The children have enjoyed experimenting with shape, balance, and form to create their own unique sculptures.

We are all very excited and looking forward to our **Peter Pan drama workshop**, which promises to be a fantastic opportunity for the children to use their imagination, creativity, and performance skills.

Well done, Year 1, for another wonderful week of learning!

YEAR 2



We have had another very busy week in year 2! In our English lessons, we have been reading the book 'Don't Let the Pigeon Drive the Bus!' by Mo Willems. The children have enjoyed exploring the humour, the characters emotions and the persuasive language used throughout the story. Inspired by the book we have been discussing ideas for creating our own versions, featuring different characters and exciting situations.

The children have been tackling a range of maths challenges applying all the skills they have learned throughout Year 2. These problem-solving activities have encouraged them to use their knowledge of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. We have been impressed by their resilience, reasoning and determination when solving the tricky challenges.

This week, the children have thoroughly enjoyed becoming engineers in DT by designing and making their own cars. They carefully explored different designs, selected appropriate materials and worked hard to construct vehicles with moving wheels and axles. We were impressed by their creativity, perseverance and problem-solving skills throughout the making of their cars.

We thoroughly enjoyed taking part in a Peter Pan workshop. The children immersed themselves in the magical story through drama, role-play and interactive activities. They showed great enthusiasm and imagination as they explored the characters and adventures of Neverland.

To celebrate the end of a fantastic year, Kingfishers and Woodpecker children took part in a whole day at Beyond the Gate. This special session gave them the opportunity to enjoy the outdoors, work collaboratively with their friends and reflect on all they have achieved during Year 2. Throughout the day, the children explored nature, took part in a range of outdoor activities and enjoyed learning beyond the classroom. It was wonderful to see their confidence, teamwork and enthusiasm shine as they embraced every opportunity. The day was a fantastic way to celebrate their successes, create lasting memories and mark the end of their Year 2 Beyond the Gate journey. Robin and Owl class are excited for their sessions next week!

Lollipop safety message - withdrawal of lollipops from school discos

Regrettably, we will no longer be offering an optional lollipop to children (via their parent/carer) when they leave school discos.

A small number of parents/carers have raised safety concerns regarding this item.

The PTFA is run entirely by dedicated volunteers who generously give their time to organise events that create lasting memories for our children and families while raising vital funds for our school. We are committed to going the extra mile for every child and, throughout the year, have encouraged parents and carers to get involved by attending meetings, sharing ideas, and helping to shape the events and activities we provide.

WATER SAFETY TIPS

TIPS TO KEEP YOUR CHILD SAFE AROUND WATER



Supervise children at all times - when they are in or around a water source.



Ensure paddling pools are always emptied when not in use, or securely covered over.



Make your pond safe – fence it off or fill it in.



Consider teaching your child to swim and learn basic skills.



Stay extra vigilant on holiday. Safety standards vary considerably throughout the world.



Learn about rip currents – these strong currents are a major cause of drowning at UK beaches.



Ensure children know the dangers of playing and swimming in rivers, lakes and reservoirs.



Only use inflatables at the swimming pool! In the sea, strong currents or winds can rapidly sweep them out to sea.

BE TICK AWARE!



INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE

WHERE

You could be exposed to ticks whenever you spend time outdoors, including your garden or the local park.

APPEARANCE

Ticks are small spider-like creatures that feed on the blood of animals or people. The size of a tick can vary, with a larva being as tiny as a freckle and a fully fed female reaching the size of a small grape!

HEALTH RISKS

Ticks can sometimes transmit a bacterial infection such as Lyme disease and tick-borne encephalitis (TBE), though TBE is rare in the UK.

It is important to be tick aware and see your GP promptly for diagnosis and treatment if you recognise any symptoms of a tick-borne disease.

SYMPTOMS

Symptoms of tick-borne diseases include:

- a flu-like illness, fatigue and muscle and joint pain
- a characteristic circular, expanding red rash
- persistent headache, confusion or sensitivity to bright light

AVOIDING TICKS

In order to avoid ticks, walk on clearly defined paths and avoid brushing against vegetation. Don't forget to carry out tick checks after being outside!

CARRY OUT TICK CHECKS

After being outdoors, make a habit of checking yourself, your children and your pets for ticks!

IF YOU'VE BEEN BITTEN

If you notice a tick on you or a member of your family, remove this immediately. The safest way to remove a tick is to use a pair of fine-tipped tweezers or a tick removal tool.

Grasp the tick as close to the skin as possible and pull upwards, slowly and firmly. Clean the bite area with antibacterial wash and water, and monitor the site for several weeks for changes. Contact your GP if any changes occur.

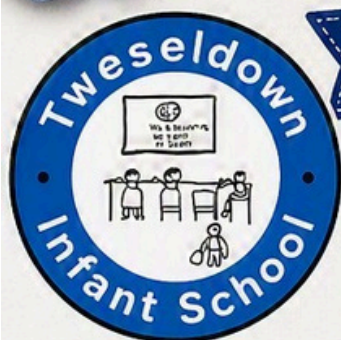

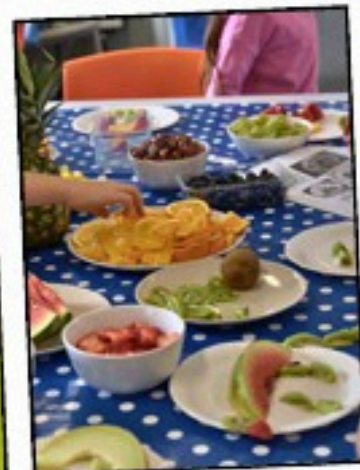
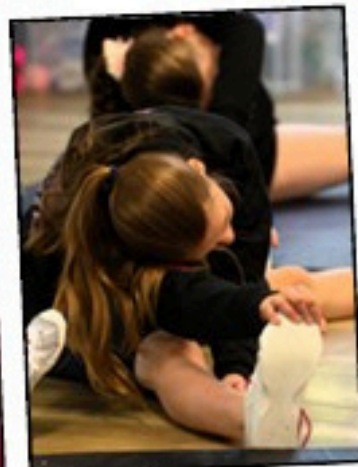
