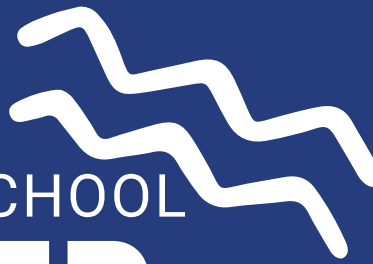

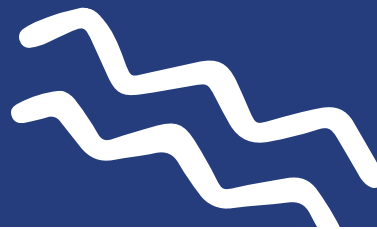
A MESSAGE FROM MRS TOTTEM

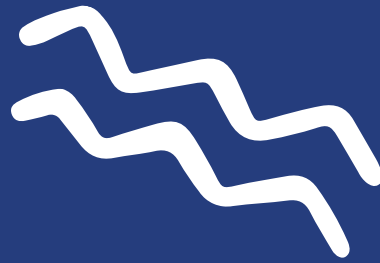

Caleb's Coffee will be on-site both days.

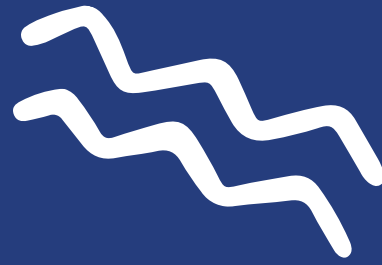
LAST DAY OF TERM - SPECIAL LUNCH

Completed flowers can be dropped off at the school office before Tuesday 21st July or on Tuesday 1st September.



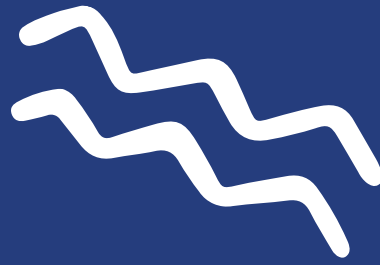
LOCAL TREE SURGEON

We are very sad to be losing some members of our Tweseldown Team this year;

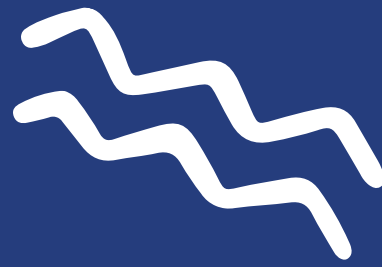
- Mr Wythe had his last day with us on Tuesday - We wish him all the best for the future.

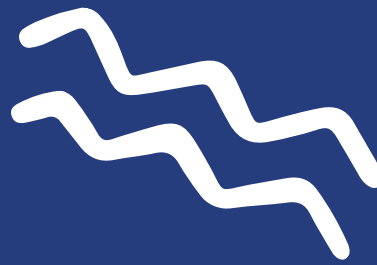


BOURLEY GRANGE VISIT

HOLIDAY ACTIVITIES AND FOOD (HAF) PROGRAMME

We would like to provide you with some information on this summer's Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme.

Funded by the Department for Education, the HAF programme enables local authorities to offer healthy food and enriching activities for free to children who receive benefit related FSM during term time.

There will be around 18 HAF schemes running across, or close to, the Hart and Rushmoor areas, with each scheme offering a variety of fun activities and tasty meals for children and young people who receive benefit-related free school meals (FSM).

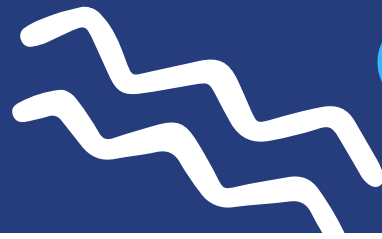
For summer 2026, a new central booking system has been introduced, which will make it easier for families to find and book HAF activities. The new system includes built-in eligibility checking, so parents / carers no longer need to use the previously issued HAF codes when making bookings.

Families in Hart can visit the [Hart HAF Booking Site](#) to find local schemes and register their interest, whilst families in Rushmoor can visit the [Rushmoor HAF Booking Site](#). Once registered, parents/carers will be sent an automatic email reminder to complete their booking when summer bookings open at 9am on Monday 22nd June 2026.

RECEPTION



This week, we became bakers in Design and Technology. We designed our own fairy cakes then baked and decorated them. To celebrate our hard work, are going to finish the week with a lovely class picnic together enjoying our tasty treats!

In Maths, we have been revisiting and consolidating our previous learning. We have been practising our double facts and subtraction skills, showing great confidence and enthusiasm. We have been working out whether a number is even or odd. We learnt that an even number can be split into 2 equal numbers.

In English, we have been exploring our feelings and emotions about change as we prepare for the exciting move to Year 1. We read a book about bravery and discussed how we might feel about moving to a new classroom and meeting a new teacher. We then wrote thoughtful letters and sent them to our new class teachers.

As we come to the end of the school year, we would like to thank you all for your communication, encouragement and support throughout your child's first year at school. We are incredibly proud of the progress every child has made this year, both academically and personally. It has been a privilege to watch them grow in confidence, independence, and resilience.

We wish them all the very best as they move on to Year 1 and look forward to hearing about their future successes.

YEAR 1

What a wonderful week we have had all about fairy cakes! The children are becoming fantastic bakers and have loved developing their cookery skills. We started the week by tasting cakes baked by some of the teachers, including lemon, carrot, chocolate, sultana and vanilla flavours. After tasting, the children designed their own cupcakes and then worked in groups to bake their chosen creations. We practised important skills such as weighing, sieving and mixing, and of course enjoyed adding some colourful sprinkles for decoration!

In English, our learning was linked to our baking. We explored a recipe, identifying its key features and discussing why instructions need to be clear and organised. The children enjoyed ordering a mixed-up recipe and acting it out to help them remember the correct sequence. We also learned about food hygiene and created informative posters for the cookery room. Additionally, we wrote our own instructions to help the new Year R children understand what they need to do at lunchtime when they join Tweseldown in September. We proudly presented our work to Miss Saunders, who was very grateful for our thoughtful help.

In Maths, we have continued to practise and recap our learning on place value, addition and subtraction. We revisited the composition of numbers by splitting numbers into tens and ones, ordered numbers on a number line, and played a fun dice game where we challenged ourselves to create the smallest and then the biggest numbers possible. We also used our knowledge to create number sentences and calculate with two-digit numbers.

Although this may be our last full week in Year 1, the children have continued to work incredibly hard and should be very proud of all they have achieved. We cannot wait to enjoy our delicious cakes together at our tea parties on Friday afternoon! Please send your child into school with an empty, named carrier bag ready for Monday. Thank you!

All of the staff in Year One would like to thank the parents and carers for your support during the school year. Thank you for kind donations when they have been needed, creating outfits for special days, joining us for experiences, supporting on school trips and visits and being a lovely smile when we open the door. We have thoroughly enjoyed teaching your children this year and all would like to wish everyone a wonderful and relaxing summer holidays!

YEAR 2

Wow! The penultimate week of term! We can't quite believe that we are almost at the end of term. We are sure that there has been a lot of reflection already, from you all, as we approach saying goodbye.

In Design and Technology, the children have been reflecting on their completed moving vehicles. They have thoughtfully evaluated their designs, considering what worked well, any challenges they encountered and what they might improve if they were to make their vehicles again. We have been impressed by their ability to talk confidently about their vehicles and the skills they have developed throughout the process.

In English, the children have thoroughly enjoyed using their creativity to write their own versions of 'Don't Let the Pigeon Drive the Bus!' We have loved seeing the imaginative ideas they have come up with and the persuasive language they have used to create entertaining and humorous stories inspired by the original text. Ask your child the title of their version! They have loved making them in the form of mini books.

In Maths, the children have been tackling Sudoku challenges, developing problem-solving skills and their resilience. They have also been taking part in number bond challenges where they had to find 3 numbers that add together to make a given number, in many ways.

Alongside our classroom learning, we have been busy rehearsing for our Leavers' Assembly. We performed to the school and residents from Bourley Grange this morning. The children have worked hard to learn their lines, songs and actions and we are excited to share this special celebration with you next week.

As we approach our final week together, we continue to be incredibly proud of all the children's hard work, enthusiasm and growth this year. They are showing just how ready they are for the next exciting step in their school journey and also a fun, restful summer holiday!

WATER SAFETY TIPS

TIPS TO KEEP YOUR CHILD SAFE AROUND WATER



Supervise children at all times - when they are in or around a water source.



Ensure paddling pools are always emptied when not in use, or securely covered over.



Make your pond safe - fence it off or fill it in.



Consider teaching your child to swim and learn basic skills.



Stay extra vigilant on holiday. Safety standards vary considerably throughout the world.



Learn about rip currents - these strong currents are a major cause of drowning at UK beaches.



Ensure children know the dangers of playing and swimming in rivers, lakes and reservoirs.



Only use inflatables at the swimming pool! In the sea, strong currents or winds can rapidly sweep them out to sea.

BE TICK AWARE!



INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE

WHERE

You could be exposed to ticks whenever you spend time outdoors, including your garden or the local park.

APPEARANCE

Ticks are small spider-like creatures that feed on the blood of animals or people. The size of a tick can vary, with a larva being as tiny as a freckle and a fully fed female reaching the size of a small grape!

HEALTH RISKS

Ticks can sometimes transmit a bacterial infection such as Lyme disease and tick-borne encephalitis (TBE), though TBE is rare in the UK.

It is important to be tick aware and see your GP promptly for diagnosis and treatment if you recognise any symptoms of a tick-borne disease.

SYMPTOMS

Symptoms of tick-borne diseases include:

- a flu-like illness, fatigue and muscle and joint pain
- a characteristic circular, expanding red rash
- persistent headache, confusion or sensitivity to bright light

AVOIDING TICKS

In order to avoid ticks, walk on clearly defined paths and avoid brushing against vegetation. Don't forget to carry out tick checks after being outside!

CARRY OUT TICK CHECKS

After being outdoors, make a habit of checking yourself, your children and your pets for ticks!

IF YOU'VE BEEN BITTEN

If you notice a tick on you or a member of your family, remove this immediately. The safest way to remove a tick is to use a pair of fine-tipped tweezers or a tick removal tool. Grasp the tick as close to the skin as possible and pull upwards, slowly and firmly. Clean the bite area with antibacterial wash and water, and monitor the site for several weeks for changes. Contact your GP if any changes occur.

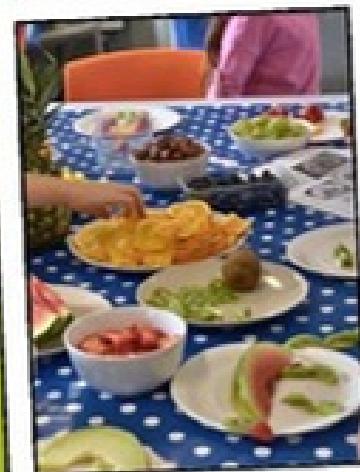
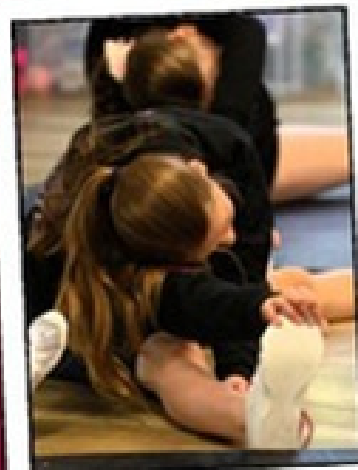
